In addition, Professor Amar analyzes the U.S. Supreme Court in transition, including how the retirement of Justice Souter and the addition of Justice Sotomayor will impact the Court. The afternoon session focuses on the Fourth Amendment exclusionary rule and recent Oregon constitutional case law, including false reporting by campaign contributors and whether buying a legislator dinner is a form of political speech. This year's United State Supreme Court overview includes a look at the career of retired Supreme Court Justice John Paul Stevens and a First Amendment focus by two constitutional law experts, Professor Vik Amar, UC Davis School of Law, and Professor Garrett Epps, University of Baltimore School of Law. At the state level, the retirement of Oregon Supreme Court Justice Michael Gillette and his contributions to Oregon constitutional law are discussed. Justice Gillette also shares his "Last Thoughts of a Second-Rate Jurist," in which he addresses the limitations on the Oregon Constitution as a tool of social progress. Finish the day with a review of recent significant Oregon Constitution cases, including *State v. Davis*, *Ackerman v. OHSU*, and *Vannatta v. Oregon Government Ethics Commission*.
